



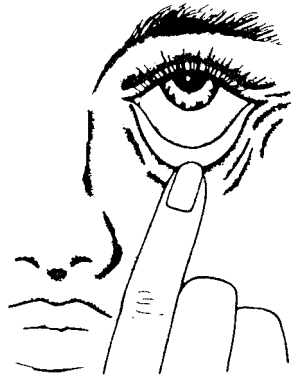

Eye Injuries/Problems

Information for patients

Ointment

- Please see instructions on the tube
- Pull down the lower lid, and squeeze the ointment into the 'well' formed



- The ointment will make your eye 'sticky' and may obscure your vision for a minute or two
- If both eyes are affected - use a separate tube for each eye
- Use for at least 3 days (longer if so instructed) and throw away any remaining ointment

Local anaesthetic

This numbs the eye for:

- ease of examination
- to relieve pain
- to remove a foreign body

When this wears off, your eye may be painful. Take simple painkillers and this should settle.
