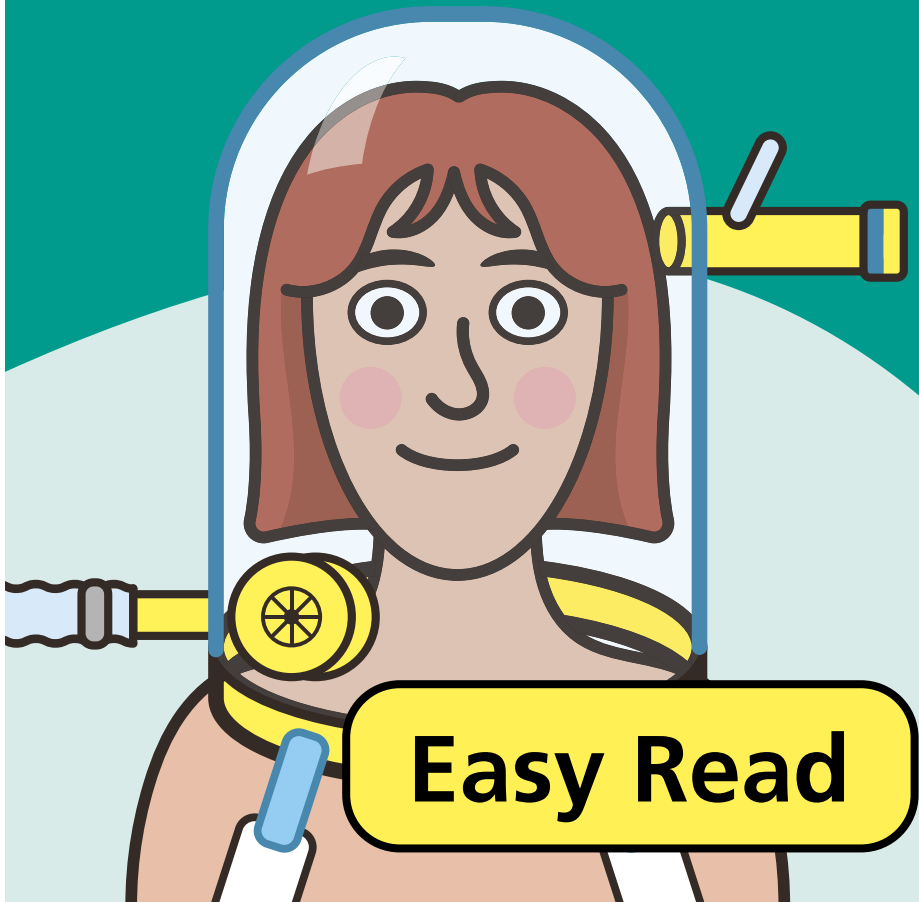


Wearing a CPAP Hood

hospital



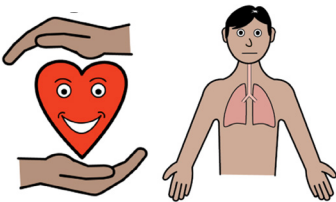
Medical staff might want you to wear a hood to help you breathe.

oxygen



This might be because your body needs more oxygen.

heart lungs



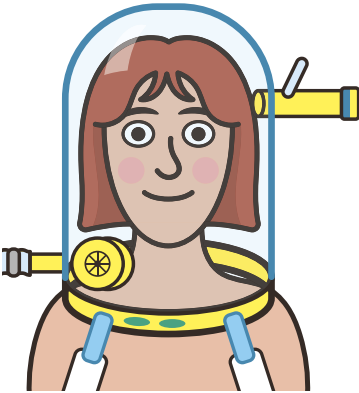
Oxygen keeps our hearts and lungs healthy.

feeling better



Oxygen will help you to feel better and breathe easier.

CPAP hood



People will call this a CPAP Hood and this is what it looks like.

It might feel uncomfortable but wont hurt.

loud, noisy



Air with added oxygen will come through the hood.

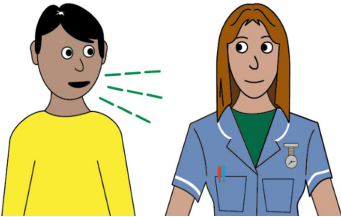
It might be a bit noisy.
