



Mastectomy

Information for patients








This booklet uses easy words and pictures.

You might want to ask someone to help you read it.


A lump has been found in your breast.

This is making your breast sick.



This lump is cancer.

It might make you very sick if it is not removed.







The doctor will remove your breast, this is called a mastectomy.

They will also remove some of the nodes under your armpit. This is to see if the cancer has spread out of your breast.

You will need to come into hospital.

You can bring somebody with you to support you.


You will have a general anesthetic.

You will go into the operating theatre to have your breast removed.

You will not feel this.



When you wake up your chest will look and feel different.

It might hurt.




You will have medication to take after to help.




You will have some exercises to do at home.

This will help you recover.




The doctor will check on you regularly.
