The team will test your hearing if:


Your ears hurt




Your ears leak

What will happen at the appointment?




The Audiologist will invite you to the examination room.



They will ask you questions about:

- Your life history
- Your health history
- The medicines you take
- What is wrong with your ears




The Audiologist may want to look in your ear.




They will use a tool called an otoscope.

This does not usually hurt.



The otoscope can help see:

- Ear wax
- Ear drum problems




You might be asked to have some more tests.




The Audiologist may ask you to sit in a special room to have your hearing tested.



You need to wear some headphones and listen to some sounds.



When you hear the sounds you will be asked to press a button.
