

# Early Cervical Cancer

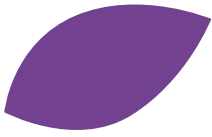
## Information for patients

This leaflet is for women who have been told that the abnormal cells found on investigation have gone a little deeper than the Cervical Intraepithelial Neoplasia (CIN) cells. This has led to the diagnosis of an early cancer which is confined to the Cervix. This cancer is usually completely excised by the treatment in Colposcopy and you will be closely followed up by the Colposcopy team.

We are aware that a diagnosis of cancer, even when it has been cured by the treatment can still cause shock and uncertainty and the difficult emotions can come with this.

We want to make sure you know where to turn if you need any support with this. There are some details on the back of the leaflets you may have been given in colposcopy but you can also access the support that is in the Maggie's Centre at St James's, the Macmillan Information Centre on Level 1 Bexley Wing or by contacting the Gynaecology Nurse Specialists.
