



Information for patients, carers and relatives






This booklet uses easy words and pictures.


You might want to ask someone to help you read it.

Ear wax is normal.






sometimes this can become too much and make your ears blocked.



look in ear


If this happens you will see an Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) professional.

They will want to look in your ear.



They will use a tool called an otoscope.

This will not hurt.



The otoscope can help see:

- Ear wax
- Ear drum problems



They will use a special microscope to remove the wax from your ear.



This might sound funny and feel funny in your ear.

It will not hurt.

You should now be able to hear better.

Sometimes we will flush ear wax out with water (this is called irrigation).
